Are You Ready for an Emergency?



During an emergency, Village officials will want to contact you with important information. So it is essential that, as soon as possible, you visit www.villageoflarchmont.org and enter a name, e-mail address and cell and landline phone numbers in the Emergency Notification form.

If you or someone in your household has a health-related issue that may require assistance in an emergency, please advise the Police Department in advance by calling 834-1000.

Also, www.villageoflarchmont.org will provide updates, instructions and other important information.

Power Outages

In the case of power outages, each homeowner **must** call ConEd directly at 1-800-75ConEd. You should call every day to report your outage. Do not call the Police Department unless you have an emergency.



Downed Trees and Power Lines

All downed wires should be considered 'live' and therefore may pose an extreme danger and should be avoided at all times. Please understand that Village employees cannot remove downed trees or any other debris until ConEd has declared a power line safe.

Please, do not cross yellow caution tape. It is there for a reason. There may be downed power lines. You put yourself and others at risk when you ignore these warnings.

Storm Preparedness Tips

Emergency Supply Kit: Put together a kit that includes non-perishable food, water, a battery-powered or hand-crank radio, extra flashlights and batteries.

Family Emergency Plan: Your family may not be together when a blackout occurs. Plan how you will contact one another, how you will get back together and what you will do in case of an emergency. Plan places to meet, both within and outside of your immediate neighborhood.

Computers: Back up computer files and operating systems. Laptop users should consider buying extra batteries and a power converter. Turn off all computers and other electronic devices when they are not being used. Get a high-quality surge protector for your electronic equipment.

Garage door: If you have an electric garage door opener, learn how to operate the manual release lever.

Sump Pumps: You may want to move belongings from the basement to higher levels, as your sump pumps may not have power.

Phones: If you have a cordless phone, plan for alternate communication, including having a standard telephone handset or car recharger for your cell phone.

Cars: Keep your car fuel tank at least half full because gas stations rely on electricity to power the pumps. You may want to move your cars to higher ground. Check the Village website for news about parking accommodations.

Cash on hand: Remember that ATMs may not work, so make sure you have extra cash at home.

Listen to local officials: Learn about the emergency plans that have been established by your state and local government. In any emergency, always listen to the instructions given by local emergency management officials. During any storm, stay indoors and away from the shoreline, until it has been deemed safe to move about the Village.
